Big Idea James, the brother of Jesus, became a servant to preach His words after experiencing the resurrection of Jesus.

This letter is from James, a slave of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ. It is written to Jewish Christians scattered among the nations. Greetings!

- My brother Jesus is out of this world. Luke 2:51-52 says, Then he returned to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them; and his mother stored all these things in her heart. So Jesus grew both in height and in wisdom, and he was loved by God and by all who knew him."
- I and my family members thought that He is crazy. Mark 3:21 says, "When his family heard what was happening, they tried to take him home with them. "He's out of his mind," they said."
- But when I saw Jesus at the resurrection, I was completely changed. I became his servant. 1
 Corinthians 15:4-7 says, "He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, as the Scriptures said. He was seen by Peter and then by the twelve apostles. After that, he was seen by more than five hundred of his followers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died by now. ⁷ Then he was seen by James and later by all the apostles."
